The Preacher is the Reverend Richard Bastable, Vicar of St Luke's Uxbridge Road and Vocations Officer to the Bishop of Fulham.

The Penitential Kyrie is from the Mass of SS. Peter and Paul (1996) by J. Schiavone; the Gloria, Sanctus, Benedictus and Agnus Dei are from the Plainsong Missa de Angelis. Music for the recessional is Prelude & Fugue in G BWV 541 J S Bach (1685-1750).

The cantor is Mr Simon Wall, the organ is played by Mr James McVinnie. Singing is limited to the cantor only — please respect this.

Before the service the candidate for ordination makes the following Declaration of Assent and take the required Oaths of Allegiance and Canonical Obedience:

THE PREFACE TO THE DECLARATION OF ASSENT

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, The Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making Him known to those in your care?

THE DECLARATION OF ASSENT

I, N do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorized or allowed by Canon.

The Gathering

The Greeting

The Bishop says:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen** Peace be with you **and also with you.**

God calls his people to follow Christ, and forms us into a royal priesthood, a holy nation, to declare the wonderful deeds of him who has called us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

The Church is the Body of Christ, the people of God and the dwelling-place of the Holy Spirit. In baptism the whole Church is summoned to witness to God's love and to work for the coming of his kingdom.

To serve this royal priesthood, God has given a variety of ministries.

Deacons are ordained so that the people of God may be better equipped to make Christ known. Theirs is a life of visible self-giving. Christ is the pattern of their calling and their commission; as he washed the feet of his disciples, so they must wash the feet of others.

Prayers of Penitence

The Bishop introduces the Mass and invites us to call to mind our sins:

Lord Jesus, you raise us to new life: Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy. Lord Jesus, you forgive our sins: Christ have mercy, Christ have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you feed us with your body and blood. Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

The Bishop says:

May almighty God, have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. **Amen**

Gloria in Excelsis

The Cantor sings

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the most high, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.]


A reading from the book of Numbers.



And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go up and join this chariot." So Philip ran to him, and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet, and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" Now the passage of the scripture which he was reading was this: "As a sheep led to the slaughter or a lamb before its shearer is dumb, so he opens not his mouth. The Presentation

The Director of Ministry presents the ordinand to the Bishop

Reverend Father in God, I present John Blackburne to be ordained to the office of deacon in the Church of God. He is to serve at All Saints Notting Hill and St Michael's Ladbroke Grove.

When the candidate has been presented, the Bishop asks the Director of Ministry Have those whose duty it is to know this ordinand and examine him found him to be of godly life and sound learning? They have.

Do they believe him to be duly called to serve God in this ministry? They do.

Addressing the ordinand, the Bishop says
Do you believe that God is calling you to this ministry?
I do so believe.

The Bishop says:

I invite the Director of Ministry to confirm that the ordinand has taken the necessary oaths and made the Declaration of Assent.

The Director of Ministry says:

He has duly taken the oath of allegiance to the Sovereign and the oath of canonical obedience to the Bishop. He has affirmed and declared his belief in 'the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness'.

The Declarations

The ordinand stand before the Bishop, who addresses the congregation

Deacons are called to work with the Bishop and the priests with whom they serve as heralds of Christ's kingdom. They are to proclaim the gospel in word and deed, as agents of God's purposes of love. They are to serve the community in which they are set, bringing to the Church the needs and hopes of all the people. They are to work with their fellow members in searching out the poor and weak, the sick and lonely and those who are oppressed and powerless, reaching into the forgotten corners of the world, that the love of God may be made visible.

Deacons share in the pastoral ministry of the Church and in leading God's people in worship. They preach the word and bring the needs of the world before the Church in intercession. They accompany those searching for faith and bring them to baptism. They assist in administering the sacraments; they distribute Communion and minister to the sick and housebound.

Deacons are to seek nourishment from the Scriptures; they are to study them with God's people, that the whole Church may be equipped to live out the gospel in the world. They are to be faithful in prayer, expectant and watchful for the signs of God's presence, as he reveals his kingdom among us.

The Bishop addresses the ordinand directly

We trust that you are fully determined, by the grace of God, to give yourself wholly to his service, that you may draw his people into that new life which God has prepared for those who love him.

And now, in order that we may know your mind and purpose, you must make the declarations we put to you.

Do you accept the Holy Scriptures as revealing all things necessary for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ? I do so accept them.

Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith and fit you to bear witness to the truth of the gospel?

By the help of God, I will.

Do you believe the doctrine of the Christian faith as the Church of England has received it, and in your ministry will you expound and teach it? I believe it and will so do.

Will you strive to make the love of Christ known through word and example, and have a particular care for those in need? By the help of God, I will.

Will you be a faithful servant in the household of God, after the example of Christ, who came not to be served but to serve? By the help of God, I will.

Will you endeavour to fashion your own life and that of your household according to the way of Christ, that you may be a pattern and example to Christ's people?

By the help of God, I will.

Will you work with your fellow servants in the gospel for the sake of the kingdom of God?

By the help of God, I will.

Will you accept the discipline of this Church and give due respect to those in authority?

By the help of God, I will.

Will you then, in the strength of the Holy Spirit, continually stir up the gift of God that is in you, to grow in holiness and grace? By the help of God, I will.

The congregation stands and the Ordinand turns and face them.

Brothers and sisters, you have heard how great is the charge that this ordinand is ready to undertake, and you have heard his declarations. Is it now your will that he should be ordained?

It is.

Will you continually pray for him?

We will.

Will you uphold and encourage him in his ministry?

We will.

The Ordinand turns back to face the Bishop, who continues, addressing him,

In the name of our Lord, we bid you remember the greatness of the trust in I which you are now to share: the ministry of Christ himself, who for our sake took the form of a servant. Remember always with thanksgiving that the people among whom you will minister are made in God's image and likeness. In serving them you are serving Christ himself, before whom you will be called to account.

You cannot bear the weight of this calling in your own strength, but only by the grace and power of God. Pray therefore that your heart may daily be enlarged and your understanding of the Scriptures enlightened. Pray earnestly for the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Let us kneel.

The ordinand prostrates, the people kneel and silence is kept.

We praise and glorify you because you sent your only Son Jesus Christ to take the form of a slave; he humbled himself for our sake, and in obedience accepted death, even death on a cross.

We praise and glorify you because in every age you send your Spirit to fill those whom you have chosen, to equip your holy people for the work of ministry, for the building up of the body of Christ.

And now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant, whom we ordain in your name, to share as a deacon in the ministry of the gospel of Christ, who came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

Therefore, Father, through Christ our Lord we pray:

Here the Bishop says the sentence and then lay hands on the ordinand.

Send down the Holy Spirit on your servant *John* for the office and work of a deacon in your Church.

The prayer continues,

Through your Spirit, heavenly Father, give this your servant grace and power to fulfil his ministry. Make him faithful to serve and constant in advancing your gospel in the world. May he follow the example of Jesus Christ your Son, who washed the feet of his disciples, and set the needs of others before his own. May his life be disciplined and holy, his words declare your love and his actions reveal your glory, that your people may walk with him in the way of truth and be made ready for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ; to

whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Investiture with stole and dalmatic

The newly ordained deacon stands and moves to vest.

During the vesting, the Cantor sings

Blessed are they who dwell in your house, O Lord.

How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts, my soul is longing and yearning for the courts of the Lord.

My heart and my flesh have leapt with joy in the living God.

Behold, O God our protector, and look on the face of your Anointed.

For better is one day within your courts, than thousands elsewhere.

The Giving of the Bible

The newly ordained deacon kneels before the bishop and he presents him with the New Testament

Receive this book, as a sign of the authority given you this day to speak God's word to his people. Build them up in his truth and serve them in his name.

The Welcome

All stand and the Training Incumbent says to the newly ordained deacon

We preach not ourselves but Christ Jesus as Lord and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake.

We welcome you as fellow servants in the gospel: may Christ dwell in your hearts through faith, that you may be rooted and grounded in love.

The Peace

The Bishop introduces the peace saying:

We are all one in Christ Jesus. We belong to him through faith, heirs of the promise of the Spirit of peace.

The peace of the Lord be with you always

And also with you.

There is no physical exchange of the peace.

Preparation of the Table

During the offertory, the Cantor sings the anthem, The Call – R. Vaughan Williams (1872–1958)

The Bishop says

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his holy church.

Holy Father, whose Son chose to wash the disciples' feet and so set us an example, accept, we pray, the oblations of our service, and grant that, offering ourselves as a spiritual sacrifice, we may be filled with a spirit of humility and zeal. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen**

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and good, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks and praise through your servant, Jesus Christ our Lord. Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and saying:

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me. In the same way after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them

saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith:

The Cantor sings

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption. As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Remember, Lord, your Church in every land. Watch over her, Lord, and guide her. Reveal her unity, guard her faith, and preserve her in peace.

Remember also, Lord, your servants who have gone before us with the sign of faith and rest in the sleep of peace. Grant them, O Lord, we pray, and all who sleep in Christ, a place of refreshment, light and peace.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Mary the Virgin Mother of God, Blessed Joseph, her spouse, St Andrew, St Wenceslaus and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; By whom, and with whom, and in whom, In the unity of the Holy Spirit, All honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen**

After the Bishop has received Holy Communion he shows the ciborium to the people and says:

The Body of Christ.

All who intend to receive Holy Communion reply:

Amen.

Holy Communion is received under one kind, standing and into the hand. People who have been baptized in the name of the Trinity and usually receive Holy Communion in their own church are welcome to do so today. Others are very welcome to come for a blessing — please carry a sheet. Gluten-free hosts are available, simply state 'Gluten-free please'.

Please remove your face mask as you get to the front of the queue approaching the bishop. Then use hand sanitizer if you wish. Replace your mask as soon as possible after receiving the host as you return to your seat.

During the distribution of Holy Communion, the cantor sings the anthem, Ave Verum Corpus – C. Mawby (1936-2019)

Ave verum corpus, natum de Maria Virgine, vere passum, immolatum in cruce pro homine cuius latus perforatum fluxit aqua et sanguine: esto nobis praegustatum in mortis examine. O Iesu dulcis, O Iesu pie, O Iesu, fili Mariae. Miserere mei. Amen.
